Key skills sought include: ability to engage students in both large and small section formats and in both face-to-face and 100% online (synchronous primarily) formats; effective use of a variety of assessment methods; currency in logistics, manufacturing, or procurement, and information technology/systems domains; effective training of and coordination with TAs; familiarity with learning management systems for grade management and reporting; and collegiality in service roles involving curriculum design, integration, and evaluation.
