Candidates should hold a doctoral degree in Industrial Engineering, Management Science, Systems Engineering, or closely related area. Candidates must demonstrate a strong interest in research and teaching in one or more of the following areas: Systems thinking, strategic organization theory, human resource management, marketing, operations management, supply chain management, asset management, economics, business engineering, data science, machine learning, stochastic modeling, and/or information technologies. Additionally, candidates are expected to show a strong commitment to high-quality research, teaching, and dissemination in their discipline, as well as enthusiasm for collaborative and interdisciplinary work at an international level.

The Pontificia Universidad Católica de Valparaíso is distinguished among Chile's top five universities, where its School of Industrial Engineering has established itself as one of the leading engineering schools in the country. The school promotes an academic environment characterized by excellence in teaching, research, and service.
