A complete application packet includes at least the following 5 items: (1) a current C.V., three summary statements of up to two pages each describing, respectively: (2) career teaching plans; (3) research plans; (4) activities,



contributions, or plans related to supporting diversity, equity, and inclusion, and (5) three letters of recommendation submitted directly by your references. For candidates with prior teaching experience, please provide (6) a summary of course (teaching) evaluations. Applications will be reviewed on a rolling basis until the position is filled; applicants at the assistant professor level are strongly encouraged to apply by October 11, 2024. Employment will require a criminal background check and may require an institutional reference check regarding any misconduct. If an institutional reference check is necessary, candidates will be required to submit a self-disclosure form as well as an authorization to release information form.
